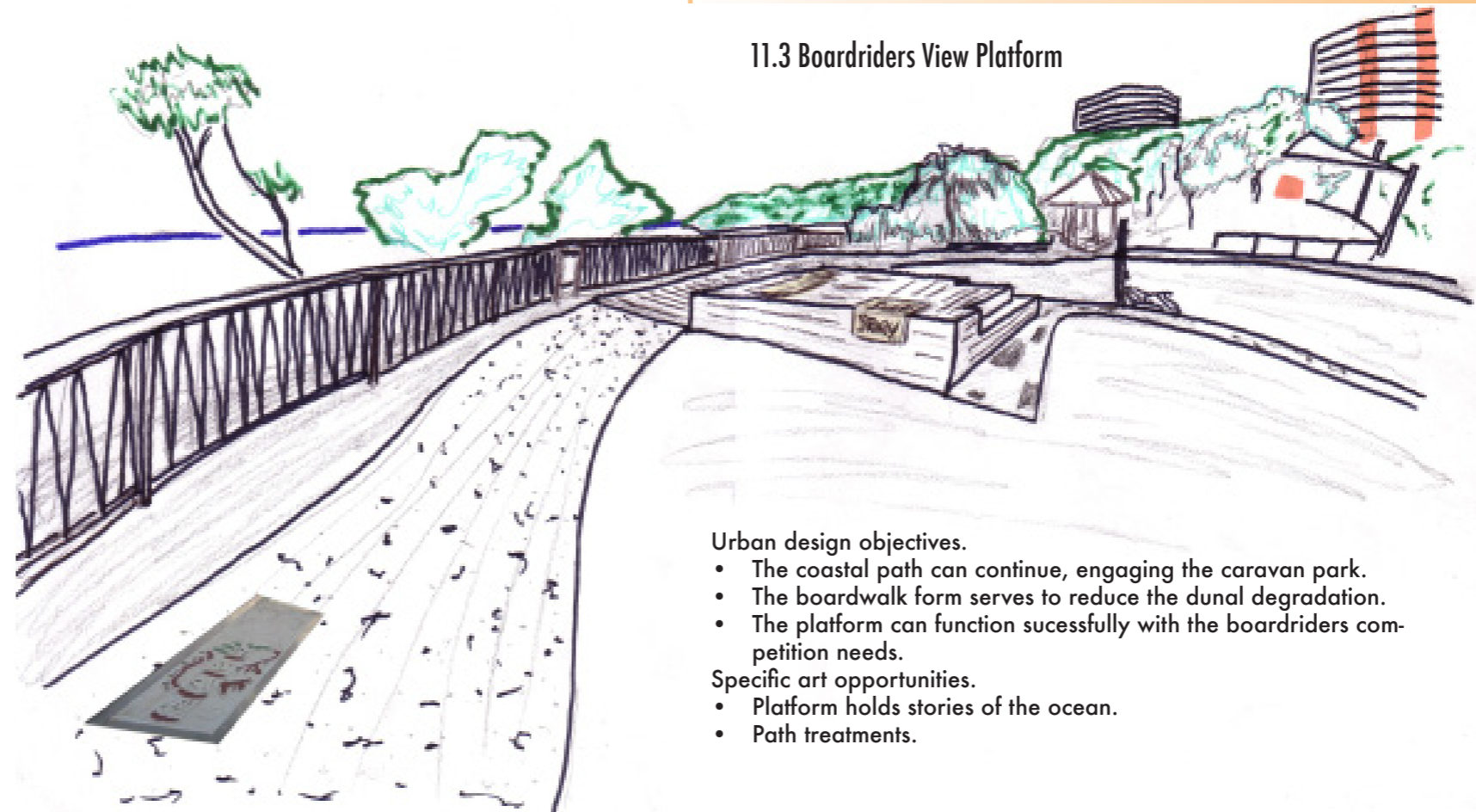
### Turtles in the Cove 2009

Coolum District Coast Care has been actively involved with turtle protection since 2007.

A loggerhead turtle laid approximately 100 eggs in First Bay, Coolum. The incubation period was longer than usual due to the cooler weather that summer and on an afternoon in May the hatchlings erupted from the nest.

Normally they come out at night but these hatchlings just couldn't wait. Luckily Coast Care volunteers were monitoring the nest and to their surprise there were hatchlings making their way to the water. They had a guard of honor of local residents and Coast Care volunteers ensuring the 70 turtle hatchlings made into the water.
